3. The content:

Mr. Arvindrao Marathe who is a renowned industrialist in Miraj and the motivational force of our institution is also the president of our Governing Council. The occasion of his birth anniversary, 12th February, is celebrated organising Shri. Arvindrao Marathe Inter-Collegiate Elocution Competition. This competition was started in the academic year 2011-12.

4. The Practice:

This competition was started from the academic year 2011-12. Every year the committee is formed to organise the competition. The committee held meetings from time to time to plan the working. It discusses and confirms the topics. Then the pamphlets are designed and all the efforts are taken that these pamphlets should be reached to all the colleges under the affiliation of Shivaji University, Kolhapur. All the information regarding topics, date, time, etc. is given in the pamphlet. Similarly social media, print media and personal contacts are also used to increase the number of participants. The awards are given in the form of cash amount to the first three achievers in the prize distribution ceremony on the same day evening.

- 1. Title of the practice: Endowment Prizes and Institutional Scholarships
- 2. Objectives of the Practice: The institute implements this practice to encourage students to enhance their academic performance.
 - To provide financial help for the needy and promising students in the form of Institutional scholarships
 - To provide financial help for the meritorious students in the form of Endowment Prizes
 - To infuse competitive spirit among the students
 - To recognize and appreciate performance of the students in University examinations
 - To motivate economically weaker students to pursue their education
- 3. The Context: The institute works with the vision of providing quality education. We take special efforts to provide inclusive environment for all students. The success of any educational institute is measured by its student's academic achievements. It is very essential to recognize and appreciate students' scholastic achievements to motivate them for further studies. This practice inspires other students to excel in their academic performance.

University toppers are awarded with medals and prizes. There is no such practice to appreciate academic performance of the college toppers. The institute provides Endowment Prizes and Institutional Scholarships to appreciate and honour the college toppers. Our students come from nearby rural area and most of them are the first-generation learners. Unfortunately, they do not get due appreciation and honour. Endowment prizes give

recognition to such students. Institute provided Institutional Scholarships to support the needy, aspiring and economically underprivileged students to continue their education.

4. The Practice: The eminent industrialist Dr. Kakasaheb alias A. B. Marathe founded the New Miraj Education Society at the centre of Miraj city in 1960. Later Kanya Mahavidyalaya Miraj was established in 1983 to empower girl students in and around Miraj city. The students come from nearby villages belonging to the families of small-scale farmers, farm labourers, workers, minorities etc. The founder members considering the problems of women education, established this college for the overall empowerment and development of girls from the nearby community. In order to help them to enter in higher education the institute appealed some sympathizers from the society and received a good response to encourage students in the form of endowment prizes. This practice started right from the beginning of the college. The practice started with total seven endowment prizes and today it has reached up to 43. The students for these endowment prizes are selected on the basis of their university results and their overall performance.

These prizes include rankers in various subjects, toppers in the last year B.A. and B. Com. and also to promising and needy students. Some representative endowment prizes are Late Sujata Karandikar prize, Late Chintamanrao Karandikar prize, Late Ravindra Vinayak Joshi prize, Late Mrs Urmila Prabhakar Gore prize, Late Prakash Vinayak Diwan prize, Mrs Sunita Anant Kulkarni prize etc.

Along with these endowment prizes, the institute offers other institutional scholarships with the help of alumni and supporters of the institute. Dr. R. V. Patil has deposited Rs. 1,00,000 in the memory of his wife

and our ex-employee late Dr. Shubhada Ravindra Patil. From the interest received, the college provides financial support to five needy and aspiring students. Similarly, our alumni Dr. Medini Anjanikar adopts one student from the first year and provides financial aid of Rs. 5000 every year till she completes her education. Then after she adopts another student.

Inspiring from her deed, the institute has launched 'Krantijyoti Savatribai Phule Shikshan Sakshamikaran Dattak Yojana' adaptation scheme from the academic year 2022-23. The stream which started in 1983 has now expanded as per the need of the time in 2023 to bring girl students into the mainstream of Higher education.

5. Evidence of Success:

The information of these Endowment prizes and Institutional Scholarships is given in the induction program which motivates the students to enhance their academic performance.

- The success of practice is in its consistency and expansion of the prizes.
- The practice motivates not only the students but also their parents to send their wards to the college regularly.
- This practice helped these students not to be dropped out from the mainstream of Higher education.
- The successful handling of these prizes with proper procedure created the credit and belief of the institute in society which helped to increase the number of prizes in course of them which ultimately supported the students.
- The number of beneficiary students is increasing day by day.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

- Day by day the rates of interest are decreasing so the institute is unable to offer descent prize money. Besides the amount which was worth and supportive before a decade, is not sufficient in the present time.
- The number of students competing for endowment prizes has been steadily increasing and therefore when interest is divided, the cash prize happens to be meagre.
- The demand of such prizes for needy students is increasing, hence it is quite challenging for the institute to increase the scope of the prizes.
